Dear All

The middle of February sees three important events within a few days. First off is **Valentine's Day** with its gifts and other expressions of love. Nothing certain is known about St Valentine himself, except that he was buried just north of Rome on (probably) 14th February. Tradition has it that he was a priest who was imprisoned for his faith around 270 AD. The Roman Emperor Claudius II offered him freedom if he would renounce his faith; Valentine responded by seeking to convert Claudius, and was clubbed, stoned and finally beheaded as a result.

Valentine believed – as every Christian should – that faith in Jesus was worth dying for. According to legend, Valentine miraculously healed the daughter of his jailor and wrote to her the night before he died “from your Valentine”. Other traditions suggest that the mid-February pagan fertility festival of Lupercalia was Christianised by the Church. Either way, it's a great time to show our love for those dearest to us.


Shrove Tuesday, this year on 16th February, was originally the time to seek absolution from one's sins by confession and penance before the start of Lent. It turned into a carnival as the ingredients restricted during the coming Lenten fast were used up to make pancakes. Perhaps the two go together; God promises to forgive us completely when we confess our sins, and that should result in great rejoicing. So have fun on Pancake Day, but don't forget to get right with God first!

The following day is **Ash Wednesday**, when traditionally the previous year's palm crosses were burnt, and the sign of the cross made with the ashes on the foreheads of the faithful, as a sign of their repentance. Ash Wednesday is the first day of **Lent**, a period of 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading up to Easter. The word “Lent” is an old Anglo-Saxon word for “Spring”, and the practice of fasting may have originated in the relative lack of food before the new season's growth. Its early Christian form was a period of fasting for adults being baptised the night before Easter Day. This spread later to all believers as an act of solidarity and personal spirituality.

Lent was traditionally a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As we look forward to Easter, it would be no bad idea if we followed tradition, by specifically doing something that will bring us closer to God (perhaps giving the equivalent time or money to those in need).

Valentine's Day, time to show our love; Shrove Tuesday, time to rejoice that our sins can be forgiven; Ash Wednesday and Lent, time to concentrate more on God, as we look forward to Easter and the Resurrection. Or you could say: eat well on Valentine's Day and Shrove Tuesday, then diet for the next six weeks! Either way, have a great time!

THE GREEN CORNER

Last month's Green Corner by Philippa Barnes about the possibility of making Modbury an Eco-Town was full of interesting facts about how we are already rising to the challenge of saving energy and the possible ways of making Modbury self-sufficient. The UK lags behind most other EU countries in production of renewable energy, but from April this year there are great new financial incentives for everyone to produce electricity on a small scale in their own home, using Photo-Voltaic technology. The PV panels are generally fixed to a south facing roof and the resulting power is used by the home owner with excess sold on to the National Grid. The "Feed-in-Tariff" will be about 35p per unit produced and is designed to encourage people to install the system with the aim of getting the UK to produce 15% of its energy from Renewables. Modbury, with its clear skies and virtually continuous sunshine is an ideal site! Worth a bit of research on the internet?

Meanwhile there are still grants available to upgrade boilers, install loft & cavity wall insulation and more. South Hams District Council is supporting the "Cosy Devon" Scheme – ring 0800 512 012 to find out more.



If you suffer from visitors or teenagers who use gallons of hot water having a 20 minute shower each morning, then fit an "eco shower head". This clever device mixes the water with air and "pulses" the shower so it feels as if you're having a normal shower but it only uses half the volume – saving water, energy and a lot of money.

And finally, a top tip for these cold winter days: Insist a friend moves in with you. Tell her (or him) it's vital to do so for the environment's sake. Allegedly, a person's body gives off enough heat in 30 minutes to bring half a gallon of water to a boil, so cuddle up to keep warm!





MODBURY FIRST **ASSOCIATION**

Modbury First is a new association which was established as a result of a public meeting at the White Hart last October.

Our purpose is to conserve and enhance the character and quality of life of Modbury and to that end we have a number of initiatives in progress. Firstly, we are campaigning against the development of large estates in the fields around Modbury for the same reasons as those explained by the Petition Group at the public meeting on 19th June. We are a solution focused team so a wide range of research is carried out, including alternative ways of providing for affordable homes and other community interests, and this research forms a standard agenda item at committee meetings. We also have a monthly food trail to encourage our members to use the local shops, while planning for a community conference – with a range of workshops and speakers to support local interests - is in progress. The conference will be open to everyone and the intention is to publicise the event across the South Hams to bring in more custom for our local shops, bars and eating places. It could also provide an opportunity for other local business, so I invite any local entrepreneurs who are interested to contact me via the email below.

At the public meeting we formed a committee and now the Modbury Inn kindly provides us with an excellent venue for our meetings! (If you too have a group who needs a meeting venue you should contact the landlord.) We have an agreed constitution which allows for democratic and transparent policy development. The policy agreed at our inception was the motion proposed by Gary Streeter MP and voted for by the significant majority at the public meeting on 19th June, 2009. New policy proposals may be brought forward by the Association members.

Our committee will be elected annually and meets as needs arise. Current members are Chas Hearnden, Adrian Gale, Rodney Bomford (treasurer), Nigel Owen, Lindsay Ward (chair), Mike Hopkins (vice chair), Wendy Rigg (secretary), Greg Johnson, Sue Sturton (press officer), Barry White, Alan Miller Williams and David Wines. The idea for the Association originates with Modbury Petition Group whose original members form part of its membership, but there are many more members now. A large proportion of the

group have lived here for over twenty years, several for over thirty years and some for all of their lives. Other members have more recently moved here and we welcome new members from across the community and age groups, as well as people who have just moved to Modbury. If you would like to join, or simply want more information, please contact me – Lindsay Ward – at this email: trevor.ward@tesco.net. Membership costs £2 to help us fund the costs of hiring a venue suitable for larger meetings. Being a member of the wider association does not mean lots of meetings, but you will get very useful updates, the food trail and its accompanying recipes, opportunities for policy development and, importantly for Modbury community, new friends!

As this is my first time of writing in the Messenger, I want to thank everyone for all the interest in and support for our campaigning work, initiatives and ideas so far. It is very motivating for all those involved and very much appreciated.
