No time for coastal path walking this month, but instead we left the car in the drive. First a little road walk along Barracks Road, down, and up, Sheephams Hill, and at the brow take the left fork and then first right down the lane edged with primroses, violets & celandines. There are some great views here, across the valley to Ermington and beyond. After about 200yds, enter the woods on your left (there is room for parking here if you just want a circular stroll through the woods). Take the lower track through the bluebell woods, a glorious carpet of blue haze. Once through the wood enter the field via a metal gate and take the well marked path across the field, down towards the River Erme. Follow the river down to Sequers Bridge and go up onto the road turning left. Then comes the tricky bit!- a section of the A379 with no path for approximately 50 yards-TAKE CARE. Take the lane on the right, over Goutsford Bridge, towards Orcheton. The banks and verges here are filled with wild garlic, a wondrous culinary aroma! Turn left into the quiet lane, after approximately ½ mile either (a) take the steep downhill lane on your right signed to Cotlass Farm, and then over the styles, through the Pathfields and into Poundwell car park, or (b) go on to Runaway Lane, on your right another 20 yards, and follow along this historical green lane (a little uphill in places) into Church Lane and back into the town. The paths are maintained by our very own footpath co-ordinators, Mike Oakins & Brian Weeks, and their teams of volunteers. My thanks, on behalf of our visitors and locals alike, for all their efforts and hard work in keeping them clear.

This month is the peak time for appreciating the early morning birdsong. Both the AONB and the Devon Wildlife Trust have Dawn Chorus walks arranged for the 8<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> May respectively- if you are lucky a breakfast is included too! See their websites for further details as booking is essential.

On Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> May, the AONB have another of their Creeks and Marshes walks starting from West Charleton at 2pm. This is a chance to discover the wildlife and creatures that live in and around the mud.

Like the water shortage, unless something is done we are going to be in trouble.


Spring is a time of change, of new growth. Let us pray with all our heart that that change and new growth affects the church as well.

## The Green Corner

For many of us in rural Modbury a car is essential so we are particularly affected by fuel price increases or the recent panic buying and shortages. How many of us drove specially to Yealmpton to fill up, just in case ... ?

If you are now driving around with a full tank you are probably getting several miles less to the gallon as fuel is heavy. Imagine pushing a child's buggy up Brownston street with two sacks of potatoes in it. That's what a full tank of petrol weighs, so your car engine has to work that much harder to get up hills. There again, on the way down Brownston Street, with the extra weight, your brake pads will wear out faster! So the secret is to only fill the tank to a third or half. You can also save fuel by removing other heavy items, like the golf buggy or the mother-in-law from the boot. Other good tips are to make sure tyre pressures are correct. Going back to the child's buggy, I know from recent experience how hard it is to push it with soft tyres. Roof racks cause drag, and using the aircon can increase fuel consumption by about 8%.

Driving more efficiently can save an incredible 20%. Accelerate and decelerate gently and drive in the highest gear possible without labouring the engine. Remember - every time you press the accelerator pedal you are using fuel, and every time you use the brake pedal you are wasting energy.

Other ways of saving fuel and money are by walking, sharing cars or going by bus. Personally cycling is not for me unless it is downhill, and I have never looked my best in tight fitting Lycra anyway.

## **On the morning of Sunday 20th May the Olympic Torch passes through Modbury on its nationwide journey to London for the 2012 Olympics.**



Over the course of the next few weeks there will plenty of individual preparations going on to make sure our community grabs with both hands the opportunity this once in a lifetime event presents for our town. On any normal day Broad Street and Church Street are a photographer and cameraman's dream, so the torch route along the main road from New Mills Industrial Estate to just short of the Modbury sign on the Kingsbridge side of town should really capture the eye and it would be fantastic to see the day's news coverage of the event including our town. To achieve that, we have to follow the mantra in the official torch relay image:

**'Join us and line the streets. It's our moment to shine.'**

The route requires the torch to leave and reach key nodes at specific times. We expect the torch to pass through the town between 09:15 and 09:45 that morning, preceded by the Torch Relay Sponsors' official Goodies Wagon, running about 20-minutes ahead.


So to make sure you get all the (free we think) Olympic Torch Relay paraphernalia (so essential for enthusiastic waving) you need to be lining the route by 09:00 at the latest.

On the subject of lining the route, if your sport is an Olympic event or if you just like dressing up, why not muster on Palm Cross Green at 08:50 in all the necessary clobber? A backdrop of a racing dinghy, racing bike and lots of representative sports all gathered on the entry point to the Town would present a visually memorable first impression for the travelling entourage. If you would like to get involved with this and have some eye catching equipment you could include, please do contact Paul Romney (831126) so we can make sure there is an element of co-ordination.

We'd love to see representatives of all the Modbury organisations, clubs and societies lining the road. If you are feeling really energetic, why not watch the Torch pass and then join St George's Modbury Relay Marathon which starts at St George's Church at 10.00 a.m. Contact Robin Chambers (01548 831447) or Martin Ranwell (01548 830452) to participate.

The next few weeks will see a steady increase in activity as we prepare for this event. The Modbury & District Business Chamber will be attempting to make the largest ever Olympic Torch to follow the real thing down the road. They will be appealing for help in its construction and its decoration. Will they achieve the record and with Modbury falling on just Day 2 of the relay, how long will the record stand and which town will it be to pick up the gauntlet and try and beat it? Please do keep your eyes open for these preparatory events where your involvement will be warmly welcomed. This event should present something for everyone. And remember, breakfast will be being served in all the local cafes!

A final plea with respect to the morning itself; the official relay involves numerous support and press vehicles all of which need to pass smoothly through the town both in advance of and close behind the torch itself. We all also see a significant increase in people visiting the town in order to watch the torch pass, so to ease the convoy's passage and guarantee the maximum visibility for the maximum number of spectators it is requested that vehicles avoid parking in Church or Broad Streets that morning.


