In the Modbury Team Ministry, we make it a habit to share a letter in the magazines and newsletters of all the churches.

This time, as we steer through November, with longer nights and the necessity of a warm home, we turn our minds to the remembrance of things past. The Church deliberately chose this time of year and starlit skies to remember the saints, the good people (men ,women and children) who contribute to the enrichment of our earthly life by the way they lived their lives. Our calendars are still full of their names.


On 1<sup>st</sup> November we celebrate All Saints Day, God's people who achieved such good things in their own lives, and who we can now imagine joining their voices with the angels to sing the praises of God in heaven. 2<sup>nd</sup> November is All Souls Day, when we remember members of our own family and communities who have passed through death, and coupled with them the great company of men and women who were killed in two World Wars and in subsequent conflicts. We remember them for the sacrifice they gave to make peace possible.

Our remembrance changes as it continues into December when we recall the gift of the Christ-child who was the Saviour of all mankind, and who has the power to heal our divisions and violence.

Toward the end of his life, Jesus took bread and broke it, then poured out wine saying "Do this act of sharing in remembrance of me".

Rather, we employ a remembrance of the past to re-examine our lives in the light of Christ as seen in the saints, souls and brave people who gave their own lives. Hopefully, we shall be changed and make room in our own hearts for God's Holy Spirit who is love, joy and peace and our motivation for the future

Before the usual rush towards the looming festive season why not take a little time to relax and enjoy some of the events planned for November.

The Devon Wildlife Trust has several illustrated talks organised during the evenings, but on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> November why not take a trip to the restored watermill at Cricklepit. Admission is free to watch the volunteers grind wheat into flour in the traditional way.

On the morning of Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> there is a walk, led by a National Trust Warden, through Plymbridge Woods to learn about the local and natural history of the area. Wrap up warm for this one-and wear suitable footwear!

If you have friends to visit, who would like to experience Dartmoor , or you are looking for a brisk autumnal stroll or indeed some easy terrain mountain biking, the Puffing Billy Track is the answer. Take the B3213 from Ivybridge towards Bittaford. Look out for a factory chimney. Take a left turn immediately after you pass the factory and follow this unmarked lane to the top of the hill, where there is limited parking by the Moor Gate. Turn left onto the bed of the old railway just a few yards above the gate. You can easily follow the track for more than seven miles to Redlake, rising steadily all the way to a height of almost 1,500ft, or return along the track at any point. The views are spectacular, and the route gives a safe 'taster' of the remoteness of the moor. Sturdy shoes are required and it may be wet in parts.

NB. This walk was recently completed (the full 16 miles!) by a group of us making a contribution to Leo's 'Killimanjaro Challenge' in aid of St Lukes Hospice-including Herbie Wilson,(the lurcher-cross puppy) who was still full of life at the end of it (Unlike his owner and many of the other walkers!) This raised £100- thank you to all who took part.

Please note we are now open only on **Saturday mornings but** details of all these events, and others, can be found in the rack outside the TIC office. *Margaret Middleton -Manager*

**South Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.**

The annual Open Forum was held on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> October in the excellent Stoke Fleming Village Hall. Modbury was represented by Brian Weekes, George Rosevear, David Mitchell and Roy Sims.

This year's key talk was given by Dr Dylan Bright, director of the Westcountry Rivers Trust, the title of whose talk, was **Thinking Globally, Acting Locally**, this was followed by a film recently commissioned entitled **DART**, inspired by Alice Oswald's poem. The SDAONB under their manager Robin Toogood, deliver a remarkable range of events and projects each year. They publish regular guides and leaflets, including their Annual Review, that are available through the Modbury TIC.

The SDAONB was designated in 1960 to enhance and conserve the natural beauty of the landscape: it covers 130 square miles and includes five estuaries. Yealm, Erme, Avon, Kingsbridge-Salcombe and the Dart. The resident population of the area is 34.00 people.

Last year over 1600 people visited the Fair, which raised nearly £700 for Medecins Sans Frontieres which was a record.


This year the organisers hope to increase this figure, their goal is to raise £1000 for MSF.

Medecins Sans Frontieres is an international humanitarian organisation that delivers emergency aid to more than 60 countries affected by armed conflict, epidemics, natural or man-made disasters. They send doctors, nurses and aid where it is needed irrespective of race, religion or political affiliation.

The A team won all seven of their matches and the B team, with new players to the netball club, also played brilliantly and won many matches.

Anastasia worked it out herself - "So for Modbury, that's half a million pounds or so." "For the whole of the UK, seven million tons of perfectly edible food".

Christian shows Anastasia how to make the most of left-over chicken and beef with stir fried vegetables. And, late one evening, with soft music playing, a very different way of eating Bubble and Squeak.

"Now, after a fantastic Spanish omelette – do we have anything to follow?"

Anastasia beamed with satisfaction and delight, performed another twirl, clicked her stiletto heels on the floor and said, "I've got some maracas for you".
