RAISING THE ROOF - THE FINAL STEP ?

By the time this issue of the Modbury Messenger is published the work on the church roof and tower will have been completed, the scaffolding cleared away and the area tidied up. Whilst the work, which was expected to be complete by the end of last October, has over-run by 12 weeks, the delay was down to the contractor and the contract was completed within the original budget costs.

The project team has been as frustrated as anyone over the delays and can only apologize for the inconveniences that may have been caused by this over-run of the work. Thank you for your understanding on this. The good news is that the building is now watertight, with a splendid new roof, a repointed tower and refurbished clock which looks magnificent when floodlit at night.

Importantly, this work could not have been undertaken had it not been for the incredible support received from the whole community in their fundraising over the past years and that raised an impressive 270,000 towards the costs – thank you so much!

The final steps

Having made the building watertight, we now need to turn our attention to the inside of the building. With its natural light and wonderful acoustics, the PCC are determined that the building will not just be used for 2 hours on a Sunday. It is a community building; the largest one in Modbury and they would like to see it being used and enjoyed by the community on a daily basis.

This is a once in a generation opportunity to redevelop the inside of the church to meet future requirements of the community. We are already considering replacing the current inefficient heating with a modern under-floor system that will keep the church warm at all times. This together with new lighting and a reordering will allow Modbury to have a modern, flexible and well-equipped community space, capable of seating 300 people; and that can be used for a wide variety of events such as concerts, exhibitions, small conferences, film shows and a host of other activities.

In developing a vision for the future, we want people of all ages and backgrounds, including church and non-church goers, to help us with the 'grand design'. We need to capture your thoughts and ideas so that we can unlock the full potential of the building. Come along to a workshop in the church on Saturday 11th March at 10.00 (coffee and cake to stimulate the mind) or share your ideas with myself or any other member of the PCC.

We hope to hold a display of the final plans in the summer more details nearer the time, and to start work in 2018.

Once again, thank you all for your support on the project.

Parish Council Report

During the Public Forum at the Modbury Parish Council meeting of Monday 9th January, the issue of second homes and the Neighbourhood Plan was raised with reference to the St Ives Neighbourhood Plan. This will be taken back to the Neighbourhood Plan group.

The one planning application for a new entrance to a field next to Harraton Cross was passed with No Objections.

Mr Martin Ranwell raised what is the 'vision' of Modbury and the bad parking habits of people around Modbury. This will also be passed onto the Neighbourghood Plan Group and Mr Ranwell was invited to attend their next meeting.

Play park provision in the new development at Palm Cross appears to be better than first thought with additional areas of play equipment around the development.

The Communications Working Group met to review the Modbury Parish Website in early January and the Council members were all asked to have a look and feed back any comments. The aim is for the new website to go live in February.

Data from the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire results are being input by several volunteers and approximately 450 questionnaires have been returned so far, well over 50% of the number of households.

The budget for 2017/18 was discussed with the precept being raised by £1500 to £30000. This will mean an increase for a Band D property of around £2.20 a year (4p a week). It was not increased last year. We are taking on more duties that Devon County Council have eliminated eg weed spraying, which the Parish Council considers are important to keep Modbury tidy. As yet we do not know what DCC, SHDC and Police and Fire services precept will be.

The 'Nextdoor' Neighbourhood Watch type Social Media Scheme was discussed as a number of people had raised the point after these cards came through their door. This is nothing to do with the Parish Council and if people do wish to join they should consider it carefully as they would for any other item requesting email and other personal data.

With effect from 9th January 2017 Cllr Lindsay Ward has resigned from the office of being an elected Member of South Hams District Council. Until a new Member is elected, Cllr Tom Holway will be taking responsibility for all planning related matters in the Charterlands Ward. For non-planning related matters for Charterlands Ward, please contact John Tucker in the first instance.







MODBURY - A VISION OF THE FUTURE

Dear Parish Councillors,

I write further to the recent survey in connection with the Neighbourhood Plan. It is suggested that the time has come for the Parish Council to urgently debate and agree a vision for the future of our town, and for this vision to be shared and endorsed, or otherwise, by the residents of Modbury.

As things stand at present, I can only see a future in which our historic Georgian market town, with its narrow streets and inherent lack of parking, is progressively clogged with ever increasing volumes of traffic, both parked and trying to pass through the bottleneck that is the A379. This is the reality of the situation. We are all only too well aware that Broad Street / Church Street, Brownston Street, and Galpin Street are nightmares to be negotiated only with considerable trepidation, patience and care. Reversing is often the name of the game.

A vehicle count yesterday in Brownston Street revealed a total of no less than 67 parked vehicles, one of which was parked illegally, and 2 further cars were parked inconsiderately. Galpin Street had 32 vehicles, of which 7 were on double yellow lines or on the pavement. Why is this abuse allowed to continue ? Any further development, including the soon to be completed 92 unit Palm Cross Green development (RA1), will only exacerbate these problems.

Surely the time has come to recognise that this scenario is a fundamental obstacle to our future, and that until the parking and traffic flow problems are addressed, and somehow overcome, there should be absolutely no further housing developments in Modbury whatsoever. The bottom line is that our small market town was designed and built in an age before the development of the internal combustion engine, and that it cannot readily be adapted to the 21st century, where most households have two cars, and the volume of commercial and commuter traffic passing along the A379 between Kingsbridge and Plymouth increases in direct proportion to the overall increase in the population of the South Hams.

As our friends across the Atlantic would say, we need to "wake up and smell the coffee".

We can all do our bit, by simply not depositing the litter on our highways and by-ways in the first place.

This is the calm approach - watch out 'Twitter' - here we come!


